

# Saxophone Fingering Chart Guide

This chart is labeled by the note name that the key most commonly produces. With a few exceptions, the given key will be used only to produce that one enharmonic note. (For example, the G# / Ab key is only used to produce G# / Ab). Learning the names of the keys will assist the player in future exercises and discussion of technique. It is important to note that the middle three fingers of each hand (labeled here as B-A-G | F-E-D are often labeled 1-2-3 | 1-2-3 referring to the index, middle, and ring fingers of each hand respectively). Additionally, in the B-A-G | F-E-D configuration, 'A' is often referred to as 'C' and 'E' as 'F#'. The side keys, palm keys, and "pinky" keys labeled are the most common names used.
